UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

DCU (Dublin City University) Full-time Undergraduate Scholarship

- 5 undergraduate scholarships available including fees, transport and meal plan to asylum seekers & refugees
- Priority for places will be given to students under 23 and any remaining places will be allocated to mature students over 23
- If you are under 23 you must have completed the Irish Leaving Certificate or have completed a fulltime QQI/FETAC Level 5 qualification
- Applicants must live in specified Direct Provision Centres
- You must apply for the course of your choice through the CAO before May 1st 2018
- Closing date for scholarship application to DCU is 5pm, July 1st 2018

NUIG (National University of Ireland, Galway) Inclusive Centenaries Scholarship

- 4 scholarships on offer including fees and maintenance support
- You must be an asylum applicant OR have permission to remain OR subsidiary protection OR refugee status.
- You must have 8 Distinctions in a QQI/FETAC PLC course, OR have successfully completed the NUIG Access Course, OR achieve 400 points in 6 subjects in your Leaving Certificate 2018.
- You must be in Ireland for 3 years.
- You must have applied for your undergraduate course via the Central Applications Office (CAO) before 1st May 2018.
- You must apply for the NUIG scholarship before 13 July 2018.
- Interviews will take place in late July 2018.
- You must receive an offer of an undergraduate course via the CAO in August.
- Awards will be announced in late August 2018.

NUIG (National University of Ireland, Galway) Access Programmes (age 22 and under)

- Access Programme (age 22 or under)
- The Access Course for School Leavers is a course specifically designed for students who are aged 22 or under and have a real desire to study at third level but are unable due to financial or social reasons. Students should be highly motivated and interested in studying at an undergraduate level in their chosen area. This scheme facilitates school-leavers from all schools in the BMW region and County Clare.

UL (University of Limerick) Mature Student Access Programme (age 23 and over)

- 15 one-year scholarships available
- Must be over 22 years old and living in DP
- The Mature Student Access Certificate (MSAC) is a one year full-time predegree course designed for mature students who wish to develop or refresh key learning skills, and to undertake some foundation level academic studies, before applying directly for a degree programme

UCC (University College Cork) Full-time Undergraduate Scholarship

- Must be aged under 23 on 01 January 2018 for September 2018 entry
- Must apply via the CAO before 01 May 2018
- Must apply to UCC for scholarship before 29 June 2018
- Recipients will be assigned an academic mentor

UCD (University College Dublin) University Access Programme (age 22 and over)

- Access courses are designed to prepare adults, who may not have formal qualifications, for successful study at university. These are Special Purpose Awards (Level 6) which equip mature students with the skills and confidence required to take the next step to selected degree courses in UCD.
- This is a one-year part-time course
- Now open for applications
- Applicants must be age 22 on January 1st in the year of entry

STUDENT GRANTS

SUSI (Student Universal Support Ireland)

- Must have stamp 4 (please consult the SUSI website for details of precisely which stamp 4 is acceptable)
- Must reside in Ireland 3 of the last 5 years
- Must apply to an approved course at an approved college https://susi.ie/eligibility/undergraduate-student/approved-institutionscourses-forundergraduate-students/
- Must be progressing in your education https://susi.ie/previous-education-and-progression-undergraduate/
- Your Income must fall below specified thresholds

Pilot Student Support Scheme

- Must have spent at least 5 years in secondary school in Ireland
- Must have spent at least 5 years in the asylum process
- Cannot be on a deportation order
- Must apply for a college place via the Central Applications Office (CAO) before 1st February
- Must be progressing in your education
- This scheme has been in place since 2015, the Department of Education usually announce its continuation in August each year


Irish Refugee Council

- Application forms available from 28 June 2018
- Forms must be returned by 20 July 2018
- We will inform you if you are successful by 24 August 2018
- Unfortunately, we can rarely fund Level 8 or above
- We do no fund private courses/colleges
- We also recommend you attend colleges approved by SUSI because if you receive your papers mid-course SUSI/Pilot Scheme will not fund private colleges. See here for approved courses/colleges https://susi.ie/eligibility/undergraduate-students/
